 - He noted that the daytime shows would be held indoors and the evening shows would start later to avoid the heat.
 - Norman highlighted the Children's Festival, which would take place at the park.
 - He discussed the festival's songwriting contest, which had received entries from across the country, including Alaska.
 - Norman expressed gratitude for the city's support and the hard work of the festival volunteers and sponsors.
 - In response to a question from Councilman Ishmael, Norman explained that a shuttle service would be provided by Kats and another company.
 - City Manager Lesley added that Bob Locco would also be providing transportation during their art show.

- Norman further explained that a cooling tent would be available on Main Street to help attendees cope with the heat.
- Councilman Ishmael reminded attendees that the golf course flags were not souvenirs.

- **Street Overlay:** City Manager Lesley reported that work on the street overlay project would begin soon.
- **Signage:** Lesley stated that the signage project was still on hold.
- Airport: Mayor Gott provided an update on the airport hangar project:
 - Delta was in the final stages of repackaging the project.
 - The city expected to bid out the project in July and open bids in August.
 - The project was fully funded by a grant from the Aviation Commission.
- Other Projects: Lesley reported that the Creek Nation had completed the blacktop at the airport.

CITY MANAGERS COMMENT.

- City Manager Lesley commended the Public Works department for their work preparing for the Woody Guthrie Folk Festival.
- Lesley also praised Connie for her efforts in cleaning up Main Street and securing the county's assistance in improving the area around the park.
- City Attorney Cadenhead addressed the council regarding public appearances during meetings:
 - He clarified that Oklahoma law does not require cities to provide a public comment period for non-agenda items.
 - Cadenhead advised the council against engaging with members of the public during public appearances to avoid potential liability.
 - He emphasized that the mayor had the authority to stop personal attacks or accusations during public comment.

COMMENTS AND INQUIRIES FROM BOARD MEMBERS.

- Councilman commended the city on the improved lighting.
- Councilman expressed concern about the overgrown grass on a property.
